



Birds of a FEATHER...

The new Cordova Park Office provides information to lake area travelers and is located just north of the Cordova Observation Tower.

During 2023, new water lines were installed at North Overlook and Howell Station Recreation Area, managed by the US Army Corps of Engineers. Roberts Creek East and West, managed by the Marion County Conservation Board have many sites with full electric, water and sewer hookups for campers to enjoy.

If you enjoy migratory birds, go to the Horn's Ferry Bridge located near Howell Station Recreation Area or the Red Rock Visitor Center deck. Spring and fall migration attract many new feathered friends each year. During the cold winter months, bald eagles congregate below the dam where there is open water.

LAKE RED ROCK

Over 35,000 acres of public land to explore...

Lake Red Rock was built by the US Army Corps of Engineers back in the 1960's as a flood control project on the Des Moines River. The lake is comprised of 15,000 acres of water and 35,000 acres of public land. Lake Red Rock collects runoff and drainage from a 12,320 square-mile area in Iowa and southern Minnesota. The lake is over 33-miles long.

Each year, thousands of families flock to the Red Rock Area to enjoy a unique mixture of nature and recreation conveniently situated between the Dutch town of Pella and the racing town of Knoxville.

Camping is one of the most popular activities around the lake. Parks and campgrounds around Lake Red Rock are managed by three different agencies: US Army Corps of Engineers, Iowa Dept. of Natural Resources and Marion County Conservation Board. This is important to keep in mind when renting campsites since each agency has their own system for reservations.

There are two must do's while visiting Lake Red Rock. First, stop by the Red Rock Visitors Center to learn about programs going on while you are visiting and see information about the lake area. Second, visit Cordova Park to climb the Cordova Observation Tower for a birds-eye view of the entire lake. While there, check out their in-

formation center for additional things happening.

With the largest contiguous public land base in lowa, there are ample opportunities to enjoy birding, hiking, wildflowers and picnics.

Birders should plan a stop just below the dam to see migratory birds of all types. Hundreds of eagles make their home in the lake area during winter months while summer sees the woodlands populated with song birds.

If you enjoy walking or biking, check out the paved Volksweg Trail which travels the entire north shore of the lake and takes visitors into the town of Pella. Several of the parks also have earthen nature trails of shorter distances. For a totally emerging experience, hike-in or paddle-in to the Hickory Ridge primitive camping area for an overnight stay in the wilderness.

Spring is a great time to pack a picnic lunch and enjoy the wildflowers in bloom at Cordova Park. Make sure to bring your phone to capture these beauties in bloom.

Paddlers like Roberts Creek which flows into Lake Red Rock. This is a great place to learn and has campgrounds at the park. The Red Rock Marina has boat rentals and SUP Red Rock offers paddleboard rentals. Check out the "sea cave" on the south shore of Lake Red Rock.

Anglers enjoy spending time on Roberts Creek in the spring to fish for crappies and during the winter for ice fishing (when weather permits). Other popular types of fish found at Lake Red Rock include catfish, bass, and walleye.

Hunters should check with the US Army Corps of Engineers or Iowa Dept. of Natural Resources to get a map of public hunting areas around Lake Red Rock. The Red Rock Archery Range also provides an opportunity for bow hunters to improve their skills.

Lake Red Rock has two beaches. North Overlook Beach is located near the campground, Volksweg Trail and Playscape. Whitebreast Beach is located near the campground and Stu Kuyper nature trail on the south shore of the lake.





Insider **LAKE** Tips...

Much of Iowa drains into Lake Red Rock, so make sure to check lake levels before your visit.

Lake Red Rock is a premier bird watching area, especially during spring and fall migration.

Crappie fishing at Roberts Creek is a favorite spot of anglers, especially in late spring.


Make sure to visit the "sea cave" along the water trail or pack overnight gear to stay at Hickory Ridge. It is a paddle in or hike in primitive camping area.

There are 3 different park agencies that manage camp-grounds...each with their own reservation system. Make sure to check all 3 for camping options.

The Cordova Tower provides an a amazing view of the lake area and a great spot for a proposal as the sun goes down!

Lake Red Rock has tons of places for great fall family photos.

Check out what remains of the Peace Tree at the Red Rock Marina and learn about the history of this tree and the Red Rock Line.






THE DRAGOONS & RED ROCK LINE

In 1835, the US Dragoon Soldiers first explored Marion County, Iowa. By 1842, a treaty was signed with the Sac and Fox called the New Purchase. This agreement established the Red Rock Line which served as a western boundary for settlement until the end of April, 1843. On May 1, 1843, lands west of the Red Rock Line in Iowa were open for settlers to claim. Around the Red Rock Area you will find signs commemorating this historical event.











HORN'S FERRY BRIDGE

Birders flock to Lake Red Rock to enjoy viewing water-related species of birds. There are several vantage points around the area, but the Horn's Ferry Bridge area located just east of the dam is a favorite. This is an especially great place to watch migratory birds and bald eagles. Bald eagles congregate below the dam on cold days when water elsewhere is frozen over.

CORDOVA OBSERVATION TOWER

Cordova Park is located on the bluffs overlooking Lake Red Rock. For a birds-eye view of the area, climb the 169 steps to the top of the park's 106' observation tower. On a clear day, landmarks 35 miles away may be viewed. mycountyparks.com -

The City of Knoxville was founded in 1845 and named to honor General Henry Knox who was a Revolutionary War hero. Today, Knoxville is known around the globe as the SPRINT CAR CAPITAL OF THE WORLD! The legendary Knoxville Raceway is the mecca for sprint car racing. The National Sprint Car Hall of Fame & Museum tells the story of racing legends. Racing events occur each week from mid-April until the end of September.

If you want to burn off some energy while visiting, travel just north of Knoxville to Slideways and try your skill at racing go-karts that look like sprint cars or a round of mini-put.

Downtown, you will find several options for grabbing a bite to eat or a drink with friends. Fun outdoor locations include Kone Korner, One Eleven Public House and A & P Pub.

Check out the mural just one block west of the square to see a mural depicting several local attractions. Go one more block west to the Peace

winning craft beers. You can also take in a movie at the Grand Theater located on the south side of the square in downtown Knoxville.

On the lawn of the Marion County Courthouse located in the middle of the downtown square, you will find a marker paying honor to Dixie Cornell Gebhardt, creator of the Iowa flag, who was from Knoxville. Inside the courthouse, you can find a painting of Dixie and enjoy the architectural details of this beautiful Romanesque style building.

On the west edge of Knoxville you will find dirt moving at the VA District. This was once the home to a large 150-acre VA Hospital from the 1920's to 1990's. Today, the entire site is being redeveloped into an exciting new housing, commercial and recreational district. This unique redevelopment was made possible through a partnership between Marion County and the City of Knoxville. The site will provide options for housing that you will not find in most rural communities with trails and a splash park.



Popular recreational activities include the Pine Knolls Country Club for a round of golf, biking down the Competine Trail and visiting the indoor pool at the Knoxville Recreation Center. Head south to the Knoxville Airport to catch a glimpse of the Des Moines Skydivers who recently made Knoxville their home base or reserve your time to make a jump.

On the western edge of town, you will find Marion County Park which has a fishing dock in addition to a large campground. While at Marion County Park, make sure to take a photo at the covered bridge. This is also where you will find the Marion County Historical Village. This village features several restored historic structures in a village type setting.

Weiler is located on the southern edge and is one of the town's prime employers. This homegrown company makes paving equipment used all across the United States.

PELLA

America's Dutch Treasure

Dominie Scholte and a group of almost 800 immigrants from the Netherlands set sail for America in April 1847 on four ships. They settled on lands between the Skunk and Des Moines River and called the new home Pella.

Visitors to Pella will be immersed in Dutch culture from the architecture to windmills. An absolute must-see is the Pella Historical Museum and Vermeer Mill. This village showcases early life in Pella, a miniature Dutch village and working windmill. Here, you can learn about the history of the Pella Dutch. In the village, you will also find the boyhood home of Wyatt Earp.


After you learn about the history of the Dutch, save time to sample some of the great food. The downtown includes 2 local meat markets featuring Dutch style bolo-

gna, jerky and beef sticks, 2 bakeries featuring Dutch letters, spice cookies and pastries, and a chocolate shop featuring chocolates shaped as wooden shoes and windmills.

While downtown, check out the Klokkenspel which plays daily at 11 AM, 1 PM, 3 PM, 5 PM, and 9 PM. The Klokkenspel features eight 4-foot mechanical figures. On the north side of the downtown square, is the 175-year old Scholte House Museum which was built by Pella founder Dominie Hendrik Scholte and his wife Maria. Behind the house, you can enjoy the gardens. Plan time to experience an old world coffee time at Maria's Tea Room which is located inside the Scholte Museum. This activity requires advanced reservations.

Around town, you will see many companies started by Dutch descendants including the headquarters for Pella Corporation and Vermeer. The Vermeer Museum is a great way to learn about the company's story.

If you are looking to burn off some calories after visiting the downtown, go to the Pella Sports Complex to play a game of softball.



Take a bike ride or run on the Volksweg trail or play a round of golf at the Bos Landen Golf Course. Kids will enjoy spending an afternoon at the Pella Aquatics Center during the summer or playing at the Wonder Spelen park which is an inclusive playground. If the weather is bad, check out some simulated golf at Nederlanders.

Christmas time is special in Pella. Downtown you will find twinkling light displays, carriage rides and stores all decked out for the season. During the holiday season, there is a Sinterklaas Arrival event as well as Christmas Tour of Homes, Union Street Players production, Festival of Trees, and Dutch Christmas market called Kerstmarkt. The Kerstmarkt features local artisans in stands placed along the Molengracht Canal area.

Relax and enjoy the unique atmosphere at downtown bars. The Asylum is a rooftop bar at Butcher's Brewhuis. The de Kelder Speakeasy, recipient of an Iowa Tourism Award for excellence, is located in the basement below DutchFix. The Cellar Peanut Pub has three times won the award as best beer bar in Iowa and twice their Bloody Marys have won at the New York Wine & Food Festival with the Food Network.

RURAL

Pleasantville, Melcher-Dallas & More!

Marion County was named after General Francis Marion who was an American Revolutionary War hero from South Carolina. When dragoons first explored the Des Moines River Valley in 1835, they found a timber belt along the river nearly 4 miles wide and prairie grass growing over six feet tall. The Sac and Fox tribes made their homes along these rivers and in 1845 the Red Rock Line opened settlement into much of western lowa.

During the early history of the county, coal mining was king with over 500 coal mines operating. Melcher-Dallas still celebrates their coal mining heritage with an annual event each June and museum chronicling the history.

The Rural History Buffs of Marion County have placed signs around the area marking locations for rural schools, old roads, towns and landmarks. Many of the park names around Lake Red Rock were once towns.


Today, one of the best ways to enjoy rural Marion County is to sample some of the homemade flavors. Wanders Farms in Otley is a family owned business featuring beef and pork. Check out their beef sticks, bologna, jerky or steaks. In Melcher-Dallas, make sure to get some giant tenderloins at Northcote Wholesale Meats. If you are looking for a nice stop while taking a road trip around rural Marion County, plan a stop at Nearwood Winery just south of Knoxville for some wine or visit the original Smokey Row Coffee House in Pleasantville for a cup of locally roasted coffee. Also while in Pleasantville, you'll want to plan a stop to experience Checkerboard Restaurant's onion rings and corral pies (pizza).

A fall visit to the area is not complete without a stop at one of the local farms. At Pierce's Pumpkin Patch near Melcher-Dallas you can enjoy picking out that perfect pumpkin. Check out Dan-D Farms facebook page for seasonal workshops or stop by their sweet corn stand in Knoxville during the summer. Nunnikhoven farms also has seasonal opportunities for enjoying farm products from tulips to pumpkins.



Rural Marion County also boasts some of the most amazing locations for a wedding or family gathering. The Gathering Ground features three different barns around a beautiful fountain pond. The Countryside Wedding & Event Center is a rustic venue with a great fireplace. If you love wine, check out Nearwood winery for your wedding reception or meeting.
